Proclamation

WHEREAS,

WHEREAS,

WHEREAS,

Because determining what kind of an annuity to buy and when to take income are a couple of the most important financial decisions consumers will ever make, individuals and families can benefit greatly from the expert advice of a qualified insurance or financial services professional; and

The Coalition for Annuity Awareness, a nonprofit whose membership represents hundreds of leading insurance companies and organizations, has designated June as national Annuity Awareness Month, the goals of which are to educate consumers on annuity benefits, support them in considering annuities for meeting specific financial goals, and encourage them to seek professional advice for implementing annuities in their income and legacy planning.
